

Casey Rebosky-Norwin

After reviewing the information and testimony presented regarding the transfer of Casey Rebosky from Greensburg Central Catholic High School to Norwin High School, the WPIAL BOC found that the transfer was motivated in some material way by an athletic purpose related to football. Accordingly, the panel declared Casey Rebosky ineligible to participate in football only for a period of one year from the date of transfer, November 8, 2010. He is eligible immediately to participate in all other sports.

Anthony Gishnock

After reviewing the information and testimony presented, the Board of Control Hearing Panel granted Anthony Gishnock a period of participation waiver under Article VIII, Section 6 of the PIAA By-Laws, effective October 26, 2010 .

Bryant Harper-Serra Catholic

After reviewing the information and testimony presented regarding the transfer of Bryant Harper from McKeesport High School to Serra Catholic High School, the WPIAL BOC found that the transfer was motivated in some material way by an athletic purpose related to football. Accordingly, the panel declared Bryant Harper ineligible to participate in football only for a period of one year from the date of transfer, October 20, 2010. He is eligible immediately to participate in all other sports.

Solomon Chishko-Canon McMillan

After reviewing the information and testimony presented regarding the transfer of Solomon Chishko from Penn Trafford School District to Canon McMillan School District, the WPIAL BOC declared Solomon Chishko eligible under Article VI, Section 4A of the PIAA By-Laws. The effective date of this eligibility is November 30, 2010.

BOARD OF CONTROL REORGANIZATION

New Board Member

At the September 20, 2010, monthly meeting, the WPIAL Board elected Dr. Don Tylinski, Superintendent of the Seneca Valley School District, to fill the vacant position on the Board for the 2010-2011 school year.

BELLE VERNON-GOLF INCIDENT

After reviewing the information and testimony presented, the BOC Hearing Panel has taken the following action regarding an incident involving the Belle Vernon head golf coach at the Belle Vernon/Uniontown match on September 7, 2010: 1) The Belle Vernon Boys Golf Program is suspended from participation in the WPIAL golf schedule for the 2011 season unless the Belle Vernon Area School District suspends their head golf coach for a minimum of one (1) year; 2) The head golf coach cannot resume coaching in the WPIAL unless he attends and successfully completes an ACEP Coaching Education Class and verifies his successful completion of the course; 3) The Belle Vernon Athletic administration is publicly censured for failing to take any action in response to the incident that occurred at the Uniontown/Belle Vernon golf match; 4) The Belle Vernon administration must develop and submit for approval a plan that there will be administrative involvement and response to any and all reports of unsportsmanlike behavior involving the Belle Vernon athletic program.

AUDIT REPORT

Wes Crease, representing the accounting firm of Creese, Smith, and Co. presented the annual audit report of the financial position of the League as of June 30, 2010. According to Mr. Creese, the audit represents the financial position of the League at June 30, 2009, and June 30, 2010, and the changes in its net assets and cash flow for the years that ended in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

Total assets for the year ending June 30, 2010, were \$466,512 compared to \$520,395 for the year ending June 30, 2009. The League's revenue share program resulted in \$236,458 being returned to schools participating in the football, basketball, and soccer tournaments.

SOCCER INCIDENT

North Catholic-Bishop Canevin

After considering the testimony and presentations made regarding a soccer incident that occurred during the Bishop Canevin and North Catholic boys soccer game on October 12, 2010, the BOC is formally reprimanding North Catholic, Bishop Canevin and the game officials for their collective failure to complete the game. In moving forward, all involved must be aware that aborting a soccer game before its scheduled conclusion is totally unacceptable. Both schools must take the necessary steps that will ensure that their respective players are at all times in control and play the game as it is intended to be played.

Franklin Regional

After considering the testimony and presentations concerning the confrontation with contest officials that occurred at the conclusion of the boys' soccer game

between Franklin Regional High School and Pittsburgh Central Catholic High Schools on September 28, 2010, the Board voted to take the following action: 1.) The Franklin regional boys' soccer program is placed on probation effective October 26 through the end of the 2011 season; 2.) Franklin Regional's administration and boys' soccer coaching staffs are directed to develop and implement a program to promote and ensure acceptable behavior and decorum on the part of all students participating in the boys' soccer program; 3.) Franklin Regional's administration is directed to initiate a dialogue with the Allegheny Chapter of Soccer Officials and to make all reasonable efforts to reconcile differences between them; 4.) Franklin Regional is directed to submit to the WPIAL on or before March 1, 2011, a written report describing all actions taken by Franklin Regional to comply with these directives, and also including a written description and copy of the program required under Paragraph 2.

PIAA VIOLATION-ATHLETIC RELATIONS

The BOC determined the following action regarding a violation of PIAA Article XII, Athletic Relations, Section 1B by the Sewickley Academy Girls' Soccer Coaches: 1.) The Sewickley Academy Athletic Administration and girls' soccer coaches are publicly censured for the by-law violation as it relates to students who are neither currently enrolled or who have graduated; 2.) The Sewickley Academy girls' soccer program is placed on probation for a period of one year effective immediately until November 16, 2011; 3.) The Sewickley Academy athletic administration must submit a plan of action to the WPIAL to ensure the situation will not reoccur.

FORFEITURE LETTERS ACCEPTED

Frazier High School

The Frazier High School administration self-reported using an ineligible player in a varsity football game with Bishop Canevin on September 24, 2010. The BOC accepted a letter of forfeiture to Bishop Canevin for using the ineligible player.

St Joseph High School

The BOC placed the St Joseph High School athletic program on probation for one year, effective November 16, 2010, in response to the most recent forfeiture in the sport of girls' soccer.

The Board is concerned that the school has used forfeiture as an unacceptable means for their inability to complete a sports schedule in a timely manner. Future forfeitures will result in a stronger response that will include, but not limited to, exclusion from the sport specific sport scheduling process.

Derry Area High School

The BOC accepted Derry High School administration's letter of forfeiture to a girls' soccer opponent because of being unable to field a team.

Aquinas Academy

The BOC accepted the Aquinas Academy administration letter of forfeiture to a field hockey opponent due to safety and health concerns.

PROCEDURAL GUIDELINES ACCEPTED

The BOC accepted the Gateway Middle School administration's procedural guidelines outlining steps to ensure the use of eligible athletes.
